Municipal Managers met with PV Chamber at the Comcast Public Affairs Series held at DaVinci's Pub on November 13th. Updates were provided.

Geoff Thompson, Collegeville Borough addressed attendees on progress of Route 29 project and Collegeville downtown revitalization and acceptance into the Main Street Program.

Daniel Kerr, Limerick Township, discussed long range planning with their board of supervisors who are working on the Comprehensive plan for next 10-15 years, discussed newly hired planner to assist in land development.

Tamara Twardowski, Lower Frederick Township talked about the Route 29/73 intersection which was modified in short time and noted CVS has opened and Wawa broke ground, new retail stores will be opening soon. She also mentioned open space was acquired in the Colonial-Salford Station Road area.

Bill Roth from Lower Providence Director of Special Projects and Technology, introduced Denise Walsh, Community Relations, and noted American Revolution Center and Valley Forge Business Park as part of Lower Providence. He mentioned 14 new businesses in the community bringing over 200 jobs.

Ed Savitski, Perkiomen Township Supervisor spoke on development at Landis market and plans for work on the Plank Road Bridge and Bridge to Graterford Prison.

Bob Umpstead, Schwenksville, focused on the new lighted entrance to the Perkiomen Trail at Route 29 and 73. He mentioned four new councilmen were elected for the borough.

Fred Schuetz represented Trappe Borough and discussed Main Street corridor interests combining business, historical buildings and residential neighbors. New open space projects with work done at the Waterworks Park, Borough Park and Rambo Park.

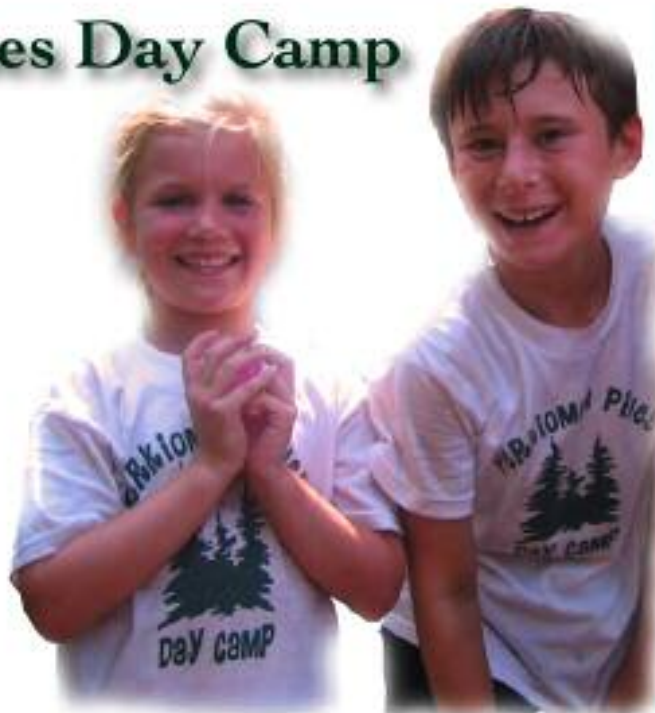

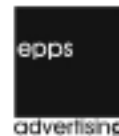
